Inter-professional education

- Clinical pharmacists are actively involved in teaching inter/intra-professionally
 - Preceptors to students from University of Toronto and University of Waterloo
 - Teach by reviewing medical conditions, therapy options, new drug submissions, most updated quidelines etc.
- Hold in-service seminars and lectures on various drug topics for nurses, residents, students and other healthcare professionals

Clinical roles

- The Pharmacy provides a safe and effective medication system within the Health Centre
- Pharmacists, pharmacy technicians and support staff provide range of pharmaceutical services
 - Unit-dose drug distribution
 - Centralized intravenous admixture
 - Chemotherapy preparation
- Clinical pharmacists collaborate with the inter-professional health care team to optimize medication outcomes for patients and staff

Antimicrobial Stewardship Program (ASP)

- Aims to optimize antimicrobial use at SJHC
- ASP pharmacists work closely with other healthcare professionals to ensure the most appropriate antibiotics use & duration of therapy
- Audit and provide feedback / interventions across the hospital
- Review and develop guidelines / order sets which are widely used by prescribers

Pharmacy & Therapeutics Committee

- Serves as official organizational liaison between medical staff and the pharmacy department
- P&T Committee plays both an advisory and an educational role within hospital
- Assist in formulating policies and developing educational programs on matters relating to the evaluation, selection and use of pharmacological products

Pharmacy Services

Clinical services

- Med Rec on admission and discharge performed by pharmacists on admission, at transfer and discharge – weekdays and weekends
- Pharmacist support physicians in VTE Risk Assessment and Prophylaxis via a VTE Prophylaxis Order Set
- Pharmacist support physicians in Insulin dosing using a Basal Bolus / Correctional Insulin model via an Insulin Order Set
- Pharmacotherapy monitoring, consultation, interventions, counseling, drug information
- Warfarin dosing under a medical directive
- Pharmacist smoking cessation (consult)
- Self-Medication Program, counseling
- Antibiotic stewardship, etc.

Drug distribution

- Paper based charts with centralized order entry in Meditech
- Unit dose system dispensing interim doses and a cart fill for refills
- Segregated Sserile preparation site with limited IV antibiotics
